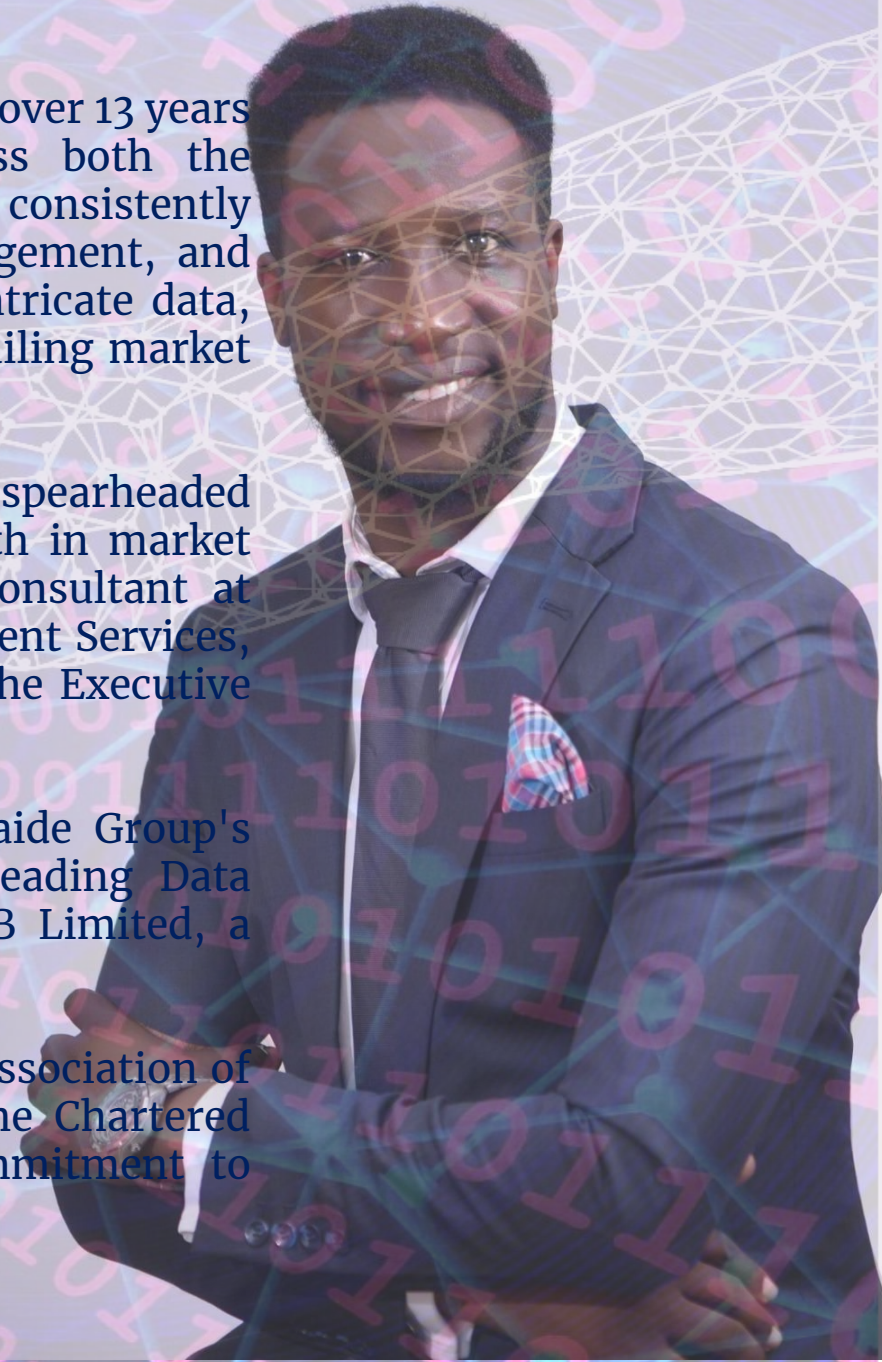

 - The inclusion of soft skills development in educational policy frameworks should be encouraged.

❑ Robust Cybersecurity Measures:

❑ Education on Digital Hygiene:

- Cybersecurity awareness programs should be incorporated and entrenched into curricula.
- Policymakers can support the development of digital literacy initiatives.

❑ Data Breach Consequences:

- There are numerous real-world examples of data breaches in education, and other industries with serious financial and personal implications.
- Stakeholders and policymakers should ensure stricter data protection regulations.
- Promote transparency and accountability in how institutions handle data.

Globalization and Digital Economy:

❑ The Changing Landscape of Work and Education:
